The TTNA will be exhibiting at Techtexsil India from 10-12 October 2007, with financial assistance from the Victorian Government – the Department of Innovation, Industry and Regional Development.

With only 5 weeks to organize this exhibition, we are sure we can do it – and do it well!

So if you would like to join the TTNA's exhibit under the Victorian banner, please reply to this e-mail immediately.

- We have secured 36 square metres of space which includes walls, carpet, furniture, lockable cabinet, fascia boards and name plates, spotlights and electricity, rubbish bin and cleaning for each booth.
- We have allowed for 6 booths of 3x2.
- Group marketing will be arranged for all participants in the form of a brochure which will be handed out from the stand.
- Non-members are welcome to respond, however a charge of \$2,200 will be applied which will cover TTNA annual membership subscription.
- Non-Victorian firms are welcome to join the stand, however Victorian funding will only be applied to organizations whose head office is based in Victoria.
